NOCA COMPETITIONS:

The Northern Ontario Competition season is now underway. The Junior regions were held a couple of weeks ago, with the Bantams happening next weekend. After the New Year, there are competitions happening just about every week until the end of March.

Our club is hosting the Men's West Qualifier January 22 – 25, three teams will advance from this competition to the eight team Northern Ontario Provincial being held in Kenora in February. We are not sure how many teams will be taking part as the entry deadline is not until January 13th. Prior to this there will be a Men's East Qualifier held in Espanola with three teams also advancing from that event to the provincials. The final two spots are given to the top two teams from Northern Ontario on the CTRS points ranking list. Brad Jacobs will get the first spot, and the second will be determined after the last event eligible for points being held in Eveleth Dec. 19th weekend. Hopefully we will have at least one local team entering the West Qualifier to play against such as Bryan Burgess and Jeff Currie out of Thunder Bay. Volunteers will be needed to help with officiating, timing, hospitality etc. so if you can offer some help, please let Karen S. or Julie D. know.

Longlac is hosting the Senior Men's Provincial February 18 – 22 and will also be looking for some volunteer help. Any Senior men (50+) that might be interested in qualifying for this event, need to enter a team by noon on January 9th. It appears that no other area club has teams that are interested so far. In order to have a Region 3 playdown there will have to be TWO teams enter the competition, if there is a single team, that team will probably have to travel to Thunder Bay to compete for a provincial spot. So fellows – how about organizing a couple of teams! It would be a shame not to have a local representative playing in a provincial being held so close by!

Dave Barker and his team of Brian Aaltonen, Ron Melhuish and Kurt Pristanski just returned from the National Traveler's Curling Club Championship held at the Mayflower Club in Halifax where they represented Northern Ontario. The ice was very quick and very swingy, unfortunately the team didn't win any games, but from what we have heard, the event was first class as usual, and the guys and families had a fabulous time! This year a couple of games were live streamed over the internet for each draw so we were able to see the guys curl online which was a nice added touch. Next year's Traveler's championship will be held in Ottawa and with the change in eligibility criteria, the Barker team will not be able to compete this year. So we are looking for another Geraldton Men's team as well as a Women's team to represent our club in the event. Club playdowns, if necessary will be held the weekend of January 10th, with the Region 3 playdown to be held in Nipigon on the following weekend January 17th. The deadline to enter club playdowns in January 7th at noon.
